Why are you here today?

SPEAKER

I am here tonight for the essential freedom of human beings. The same reason I went to East Timor. The same reason I served there. I served with the people of East Timor Australia for their independence and their freedom. And if you think back to the 1990s, the East Timor Marines were screaming for freedom. And they fought, and they fought, and they fought, and they go their freedom. And I was more than happy to go. After I served my time, I thought I would relax. I suffered a lot as a result of my service. But I thought I'd relax and retire. But this is something we cannot...we can no longer ignore this. It's garbage. I was at the first march, proud to be there. The second March, people we're afraid. That fear just means False Evidence Appearing Real. Or Face Everything And Recover.

A World War 2 Veteran told me that. And that is what fear is. There's nothing wrong with fear. There's nothing wrong with anxiety. Courage is just having pain, but still doing what you know the right thing to do is even when you're afraid. That's the simple definition of courage. Even when I'm shaking and scared, I still stand up for FREEDOM. We all need to do that.
